The gatherings inspired visionary Canberra artist and prehistorian Dorothy Cameron to write The Singing Hill. Last year, Canberra's Chorus of Women created a video of 'The Singing Hill' story with Jo Vallentine reading the poem. This has been a central and moving feature at WCC National Congress of Women events.

We present the Charter today to support and encourage the women, and all members and senators of the 47th Parliament, to bring harmony, collaboration, compassion and kindness towards each other, all life and the living Earth, which supports us all.

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
